## GRANTS

### Community Trauma Team

Partnering with the Clarke, Murray, Central Decatur, and Lamoni Community School Districts, the Foundation led the effort to acquire a \$314,743 federal grant that will fund the purchase of tele-education equipment that will be used by the hospital, schools and our communities to provide education and training on causes, symptoms, and treatment for children who are suffering from childhood trauma. The DEKKO Foundation awarded a \$45,000 grant to the Foundation to assist with funding for educational content and training.

### Bras for the Cause \$10,000

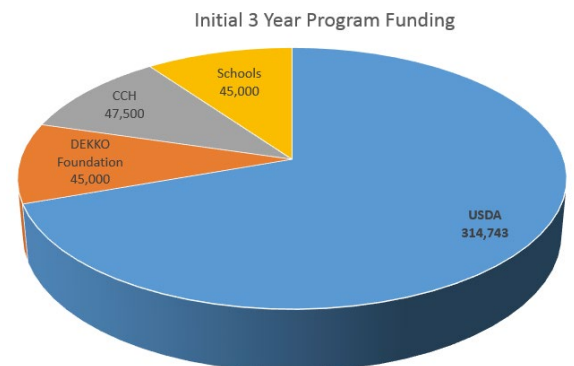

### Planned Giving

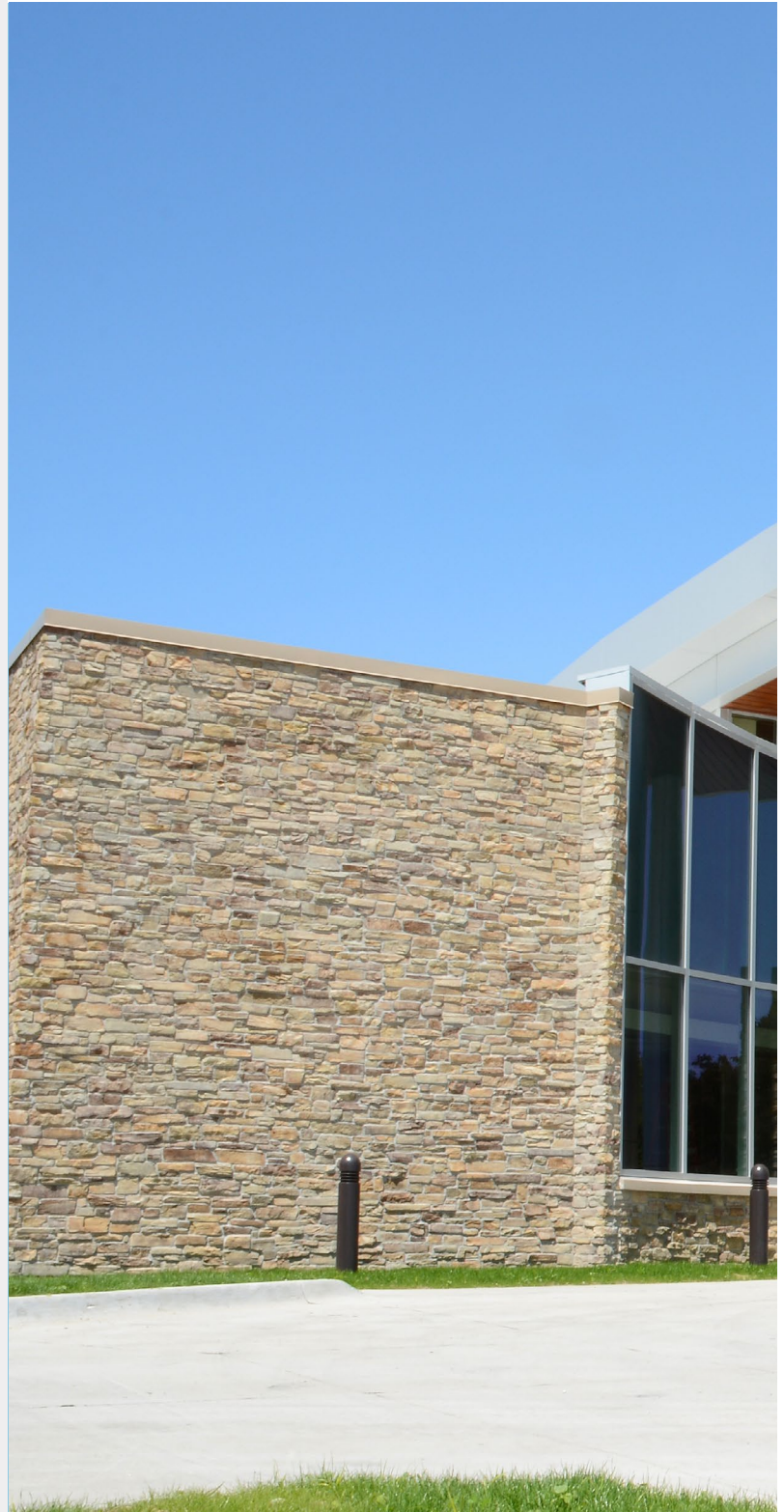
